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1990 Minnesota Social and Economic Characteristics

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How many people in Minnesota were born here? What is the median household income for Minnesotans? Is the farm population increasing or decreasing? How many Minnesotans are high-school graduates? What percentage of the population is below poverty in Minnesota?

The Demographer's Office within Minnesota Planning answers over 10,000 requests each year on Census and related federal information. This is the second in a continuing series of "samplers" from the 1990 Census. These are some of the commonly asked questions and interesting facts recently released by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census.

This information is available from the Demographer's Office at Minnesota Planning, 61 State Data Centers and 142 Economic Business Information Network members located throughout the state.

The information displayed below come from the sample portion of the Census. The correct citation for the information is Summary Tape File 3A (STF-3A).

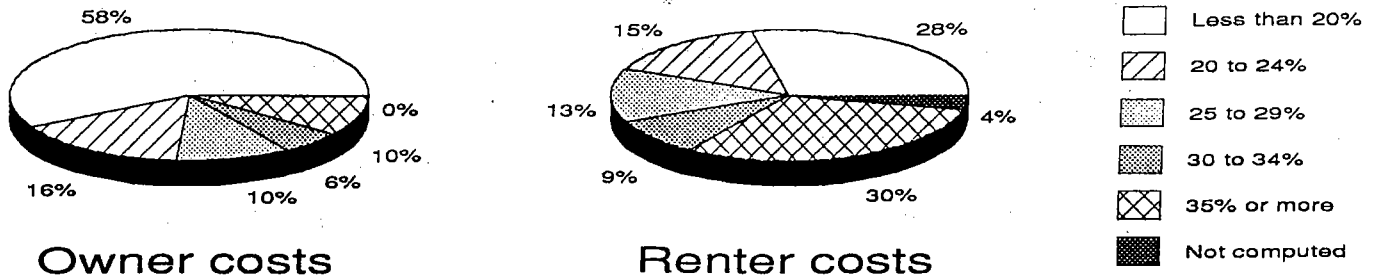

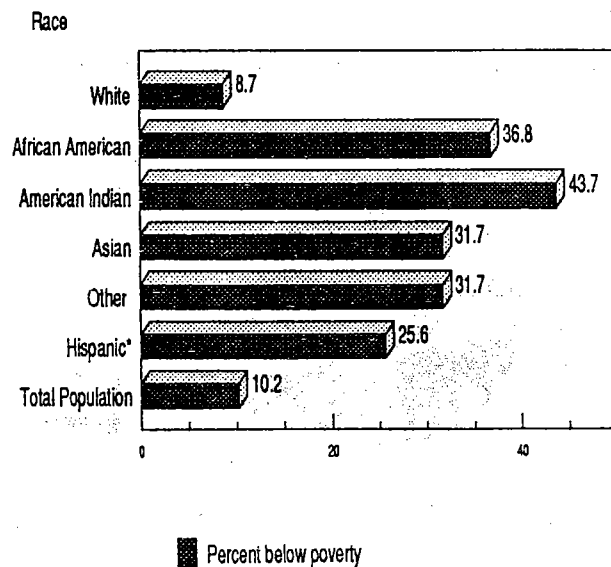
